## **HOW TO WRITE AN ESSAY**

In English, we normally find two types of essay:

- 1. PROS & CONS (Advantages vs. disadvantages)
- 2. OPINION ESSAY

NOTE: They both are written into <u>paragraphs</u>, but the way they are organized changes in terms of <u>content</u>, <u>approach</u> and <u>style</u>.

PROS & CONS ESSAY	OPINION ESSAY
Introduction: background information about the topic. The main idea is presented in a general and neutral way. NO PERSONAL OPINION in this paragraph.	Introduction: the writer's personal opinion about the prompt is stated straightaway.
Body: the advantages and disadvantages are stated in different paragraphs. We frequently use On the one hand to refer to refer to advantages, and On the other hand to present the disadvantages.	<b>Body:</b> the proper opinion about the topic has to be reasoned with topic sentences in each paragraph. Therefore, each topic sentence will have a supporting sentence (or more than one) and some examples.
In this section, reasons and examples to enrich the advantages and disadvantages, as well as linkers and adverbs should be used.	Example: Do you think mobile phones are dangerous for children?  1. Intro: your opinion. 2. Topic sentence 1 (1 <sup>st</sup> idea that supports your opinion), is followed by 1 or 2 supporting sentences. In other words, they are the reason(s) which reinforce your first idea. Then, some examples could be quite meaningful to reflect your opinion. 3. Topic sentence 2: same process. 4. Conclusion: your opinion and the main reasons presented are summarised for the reader to have a clear 'picture' of the ideas discussed in the writing.
Conclusion: a balance needs to be done in this paragraph. We have to summarise the main ideas discussed and present an opinion based on its advantages and disadvantages mentioned above.  Sometimes, a final reflection can be written to end up this essay by for example adding a rhetorical question or a normal reflection based on how the concrete topic has an impact on society or how this could eventually affect people in the future.
